

PIAA Eco Challenge

Getting the best time from the least fuel

n recognition of the need to promote fuel conservation, the PIAA Eco Challenge Award was introduced in 2007. The award is given to the team that gets the best time from the least fuel. It is open to national and regional teams, based on their total scores from Saturday's stages, multiplied by the amount of fuel they consume. This rewards teams who manage their resource the most responsibly while still having great fun behind the wheel.

Teams who registered for the PIAA Eco Challenge pay no fee, but must place two supplied PIAA decals prominently on the vehicle. At the start on Saturday, each participating team's gas tank is filled and a seal affixed to the fuel

filler. At each refuelling stop and at the final MTC, the seal is inspected, broken to refuel and a new seal affixed. The team's fuel cans are weighted before and after the refuelling and this weight is recorded as a measure of the fuel added.

The fuel zone marshals will be judges of fact for checking seals, weight of fuel added and verifying that the tank is full at the finish.

PIAA will award a prize to the top team in the 2011 PIAA Eco Challenge and the winner will be announced during the post-event banquet.

All PFR entrants will receive a pair of PIAA silicone windshield wiper blades.

BEST VANTAGE POINTS

IMPORTANT NOTICE: The forest spectator locations are remote and do not have services such as toilets or concessions, so make sure to plan ahead. Bring in everything you need, and leave nothing behind.

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 30:

Come to the Canadian Tire location, 2761 Forksdale Ave., between 1pm and 4pm to see all the cars and meet competitors. The cars will start from here at 5:30pm.

"ACTIVE MOUNTAIN" Super Special:

From Merritt: proceed south along Voght Street. After crossing a small bridge, keep to the Right (don't drive into Tolko Yard) and then turn Left onto Midday Valley Road. Approx. 0.8km from the start of Midday Valley Road, continue straight ahead where road turns into gravel. From there, follow signs to spectator area(s). There is a slight hike to the best vantage point in the park. This is private property—please take away all garbage.

Open from 5pm to 7:30pm. Cars pass twice: 5:45pm and 6:30pm.

"CUTOFF ROAD" Night Special:

From Merritt or Vancouver: take Highway 97C heading East from the junction with Highway 5 (Exit 286). At the top of the hill, approx. 8km east of Exit 286, turn Right and follow the signs. The parking is about 500m down this road.

From Kelowna: take Highway 97C heading West towards Merritt, 8km before Merritt, just after the "Trucks Brake Check", turn Left and follow signs. The parking is about 500m down this road.

Open from 8pm to 10pm. Bring flashlights and wear warm bright clothing. Cars pass twice: 8:30pm and 9:30pm.

SATURDAY OCTOBER 1:

Come to the Canadian Tire location, 2761 Forksdale Ave., between 8am and 9:30am to see all the cars and meet competitors. Throughout the day, the competitors will return here for their service breaks.

"DILLARD" Forest Special:

From Merritt: proceed along Hwy 97C, east towards Kelowna. Take the Loon Lake exit (about 38km from the junction with Hwy 5). Turn Right at the end of the exit, onto the gravel road called Shrimpton Creek. Follow the spectator signs down this road for 13km, keeping Right at 1.5km, and keeping Right again at 9.5km. The start of the stage is at the 13km mark. From here, marshals will direct you to drive into the stage 500m to a hairpin junction, where there is plenty of parking. Access will be closed 30 minutes before the cars are due—you should plan to stay for both passes.

Access is open between 9am and 10:20am. Cars pass twice: 10:50am and 11:45am.

"MAB LAKE" Forest Special:

From Merritt: proceed along Hwy 5 northbound. Take Exit 315 (Helmer Road) and turn Left at the T-junction, then follow marshals' directions. The main spectator point is a 1km drive into the stage. If access is closed when you arrive, there is still viewing available from this location, but the best action is from the main spectator point. There will be vehicle access in and out between each run of the stage.

Open from 2pm to 5:30pm. Cars pass twice: 2:30pm and 4:30pm.

"HELMER LAKE" Forest Special:

From Merritt: proceed along Hwy 5 northbound. Take Exit 315 (Helmer Road) and turn Right at the T-junction, proceed under the highway to the west side, then proceed straight ahead through the gate and follow marshals' directions to park in the open area on your right, just past the gate. There is good viewing 100m from the parking area, but the best viewing area is about a 900m walk into the stage from here.

Open from 5:30pm to 8pm. Cars pass twice: 6:10pm and 7:10pm.

Spotlight on 20-year-old Max Riddle

ancouver's Max Riddle began his official racing career in 2006 at age 15, placing third in the Stars of Karting finale. From karting, Riddle proceeded to the Skip Barber Western series in 2008 as well as competing in four races for the Atlanta Motorsports Group.

In 2010, Riddle won his first-ever rally event at Kelowna's Big White Rally 2010.

His first U.S. rally event was Olympus 2011, round three of the Rally America National Championship in which he placed 8th overall and 1st in the event's John Nagel Regional.

In this year's Rallye Baie Des Chaleurs, round 3 of the Canadian Rally Championship, Riddle achieved a 5th overall standing and was the only driver in the top-five standing to have never won a national rally outright. The other members of that tough Quebec field were David Higgins, a US champion; Antoine L'Estage, a Canadian and US champion; Ramana Lagemann, exfactory driver for Subaru USA; and Travis Hansen, Rally America national points leader at the time.

North American multi-year rally champion Patrick Richard, and his Squamish, BC-based Rocket Rally Racing Company, built Riddle's competition car. In addition, Rocket Rally maintains and provides services for Riddle's vehicle at all events.

Richard's mentorship has been instrumental in Riddle's success this year. Riddle's seat time has included multiple monthly testing sessions plus invaluable driving tips from the senior driver, who continues to prepare this young up-and-comer for greater success.

Another key component in Riddle's success is codriver Aaron Neumann, a three time Western Canadian Rally Champion.

The pair won the Cochrane Winter Rally in March this year, competing in their 2007 Subaru STI.

Get Involved and Join a Rally Club

Getting involved in your local club is the best way to see what is going on. help out a local team, or volunteer at the event.

Volunteering is the best way to get a feel for how a rally works and to get to see the rally up close.

Getting started in competition is as easy as entering an event.

NAVIGATIONAL RALLIES, also know as TSD or Time Speed Distance Rallies, are navigational challenges where teams are given routes to follow and average speeds to maintain. While the speeds are below the posted limit the roads used are usually still a challenge for both the driver and navigator. TSDs are often a gateway to rallying but the top level competition can be really intense. First aid kits, emergency triangles and fire extinguishers are normally all that are required. Serious competitors will consider skid-plates, driving lights, rally computers (specific TSD computers are available), map lights and special-

RALLY CROSS events are excellent events to get comfortable driving a car at its limit on loose surfaces. Typically held on open and flat areas, the speeds are slow, compared to stage roads, and normally safe. Car preparation is normally limited to removing loose items and making sure the car is mechanically sound. Again, at the top level competition can get serious and preparation will include lightening the car, improved suspension, specialized tires and race seats. Safety equipment is limited to a helmet meeting CARS standards for RallyCross.

> **RALLY SPRINT** events are a stepping stone to performance rallies. Car safety and preparation rules match those of performance rally. Some driver equipment requirements are relaxed but CARS does recommend using all of the performance rally safety equipment if possible. Rallysprint events are made up of stages less than 3km in length with an average speed slower than 80km/h. Only one car can be on a stage at a time.

> **REGIONAL RALLY** events are the first level of performance rally events that require specific licencing and

full safety equipment as listed in the National Rally Regulations. Regional events and championships are normally strongly contested and offer tight competition. The level of equipment is generally more modest than is found at the highest level in the National Championship but the cars are fully prepared performance rally cars. Total stage distance is less than you'll find at a national and regional organisers tend to stay away from long stages.

There are three regional championships in Canada, the Championnat de Rallye du Québec, the Ontario Performance Rally Championship and the Western Canada Rally Championship.

NATIONAL RALLY events require an enhanced competition license and bring the best in the country together to compete on the stages. Stage distances are longer and schedules can be less 'friendly' and more time consuming than regional events.

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
