
Vintage Racing Club of BC Meeting Minutes

SCCBC Update

SCCBC has completed several track upgrades including paving improvements to the track and the purchase of a new forklift that can be dual purposed as a pace car (according to Keith anyway.

He will be submitting for a change to FIA requirements whereby we will allow the turn workers the ability to raise the RED Flag and then report to the Tower. It appears that for our venue waiting for turn reports to be relayed to the Tower causes a time delay which could be serious for the drivers.
